

The United States decision striking down Roe v Wade has made many pro-choice women reach out to me in fear that our country will become like the US.

Press Release: Chilliwack Pregnancy Care announces "The Cherish Project"

Chilliwack - Laura Kingma, President of the Chilliwack Pregnancy and Compassionate Care Centre, today announced a "culture change" project called The Cherish Project. The goal of the project is to change hearts, reminding the people of Chilliwack that every person, including those in the womb, deserves love.

The project consists of two large billboards bearing this positive message, as well as associated advertising beginning in the fall directing people toward the Care Centre, which has been operating in Chilliwack for 42 years.

"Canadian society needs a change of heart toward the unborn," Kingma said. "Just as every person outside the womb has value, every girl and boy in the womb is precious, too. They all deserve unconditional love."

Kingma pointed out that the Pregnancy Care Centre offers help to women whether or not they are pregnant. The Centre has recently trained two additional peer counselors, and offers non-judgmental counseling, free pregnancy tests and ultrasounds, and all things practical for moms, from diapers and food to strollers. Post-abortive support is also available. Through the community outreach programs of the Compassionate Care Centre, bread is delivered weekly and phone support is provided to lonely seniors. A mobile unit brings services to clients who are not able to come into the Centre. "We try to demonstrate every day that we cherish every person," said Kingma, "and we want the people of Chilliwack to know about the practical services we provide."

One billboard is located by the TransCanada westbound, just before the Vedder Bridge. The other is near the TransCanada eastbound, just after Prest Road. Up to 100,000 people per day coming in and out of Vancouver will see the billboards.

Concluded Kingma: "Now more than ever we need to step up, we need to stand and support people in any and all of their life circumstances. We need to cherish the grandparents, the mothers and fathers, and the children. That's what The Cherish Project is all about."

August 9, 2022 | Canada: Abortion Pill Reversal is happening in Canada, and lives are being saved

estate agent who began a chemical abortion, changed her mind, and attempted to save her baby's life. The woman, being pressured to have an abortion at nine weeks' gestation, drove hours from her home to get the abortion pill. She ingested the pill and began her drive back home. As she drove, she saw pro-life billboards along the roadside. One stated, "There is a heartbeat at 18 days." The woman continued driving, her decision beginning to weigh heavy on her heart. She then came across another billboard that stated, "Your mom chose life. You should too." The woman began to regret taking the abortion pill, and immediately exited the highway and began searching online to see if there was any way to save her baby. She stumbled across a website that offered her baby a "second chance at life." The woman immediately called the organization. They connected her with a pro-life doctor who sent her a prescription for the reversal pills to pick up in her hometown that same day. Six hours after ingesting the chemical abortion pill, the woman began the reversal process and was overjoyed to find a week later that her baby still had a heartbeat.
